

About the Speakers

CLARK B. HALL

Mr. Hall has written and lectured widely on cavalry operations in the American Civil War. He is a president of The Brandy Station Foundation and a co-founder and past board member of the Chantilly Battlefield Association and Association for the Preservation of Civil War Sites. He is the author of numerous articles over the years and has been awarded wide acclaim for his writing and for his battlefield preservation work. He is a graduate of Kansas State where he did graduate work in both law and history.

MARSHALL D. KROLICK

Mr. Krollick is an attorney and a past president of The Civil War Round Table of Chicago. He is a recipient of The Round Table's Nevins-Freeman Award for distinguished scholarship and dedication to Civil War study. He speaks on a regular basis to Civil War organizations and symposiums, guides tours of Gettysburg and other Civil War battlefields, and his written articles have appeared in many Civil War magazines.

HORACE MEWBORN

Mr. Mewborn has authored five articles for "Blue and Gray Magazine" about cavalry operations in the Civil War. He is co-author of *The 43rd Battalion, Virginia Cavalry* and editor of *From Mosby's Command*. He is frequently asked to lead battlefield tours throughout Virginia.

ROBERT F. O'NEILL, JR.

Mr. O'Neill is a leading authority on cavalry operations in the American Civil War. He is the author of *The Cavalry Battles of Aldie, Middleburg and Upperville* and is currently at work on *Chasing JEB Stuart and John Mosby, the Union Cavalry in Northern Virginia Between Second Manassas and Gettysburg*. He has written numerous articles for "Blue and Gray" and "Gettysburg Magazine" and is frequently requested to lead battlefield tours.

JAMES EWELL BROWN STUART, IV

JEB Stuart is a wealth management Advisor and Vice President with the brokerage firm of Merrill Lynch in Richmond. He has a BA from the University of Virginia and an MA in Industrial Engineering from North Carolina State. Colonel Stuart served 27 years in the U.S. Army including two combat tours in Vietnam, retiring in 1985. For eight years he has served as Chairman of the Board at The Museum of the Confederacy and as President for The Sons of the Revolution in the state of Virginia.

ROBERT J. TROUT

Mr. Trout is a retired educator who has spent many years researching JEB Stuart, the cavalry, and the horse artillery. He has authored several books including *Galloping Thunder*, a history of the Stuart Horse Artillery Battalion.

BRUCE M. VENTER

Dr. Venter holds a BA in History from Manhattan College and a doctorate in Educational Administration from the University of Albany. He is a frequent speaker on Union Cavalry operations. His articles have appeared in "Blue and Gray," "Civil War" and "The Washington Times." He is also the founder and CEO of America's History LLC, which specializes in uniquely designed tours for serious history enthusiasts.

ERIC J. WITTENBERG

Mr. Wittenberg is an attorney working in the business development and litigation arenas. He is a native of southeastern Pennsylvania and has studied Civil War Cavalry operations for most of his life. He is the author of over 15 articles and 11 books. His first book, *Gettysburg's Forgotten Cavalry Actions*, published in 1988, won the Bachelder-Coddington Award for his research and interpretation of the Battle of Gettysburg.
